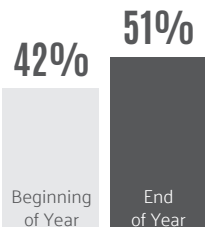

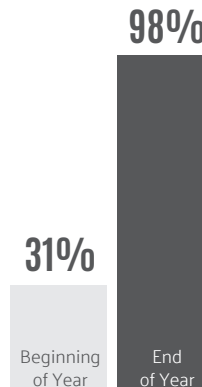

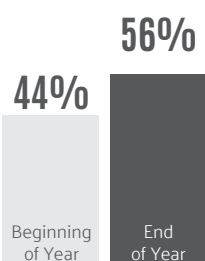

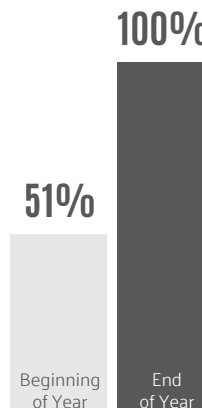

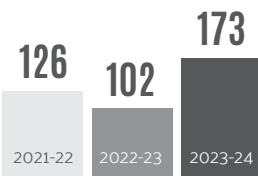

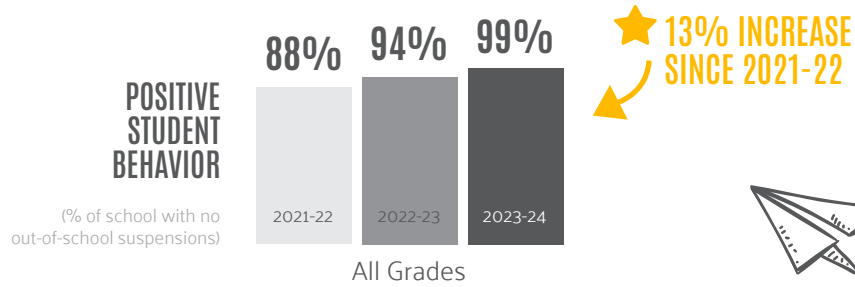


STUDENT MENTAL HEALTH

64% increase in support group interventions (from 61 to 100 students)



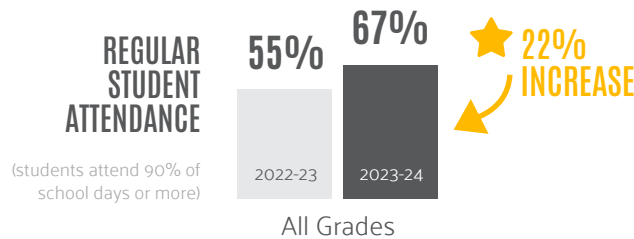
Community School strategies that support social-emotional wellness and positive culture and climate:

283 students were referred for Attendance Team services, up from 57 in 2022-23. Of those students referred for services, **100% were connected to attendance supports.**

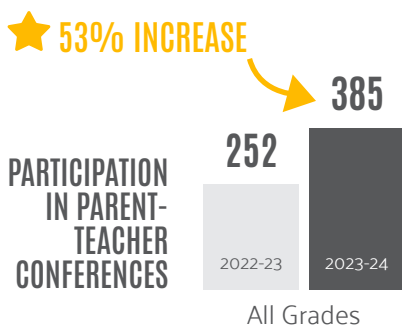
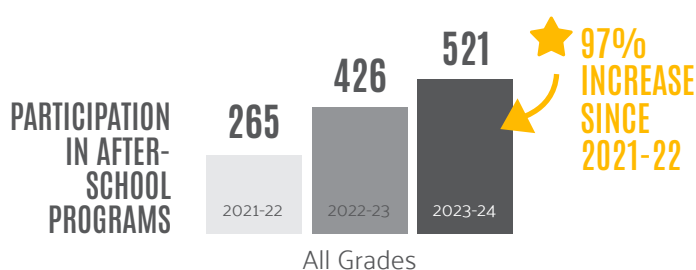
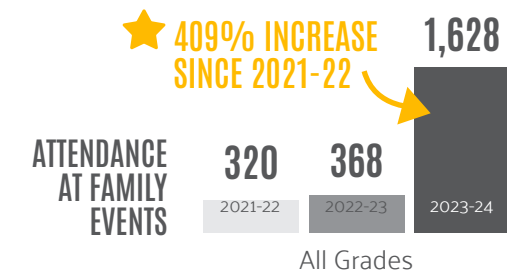

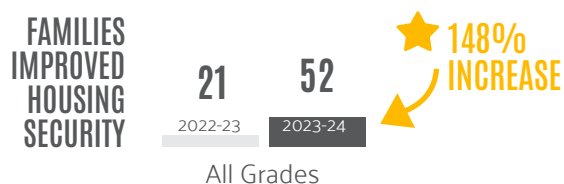
